January 8, 1923 - October 4, 2012

Hastings resident A. Jeannette Stahl, 89, died Thursday, October 4, 2012, at Mary Lanning HealthCare in Hastings, NE.

Funeral services are 10:30 a.m., Tuesday, October 9, 2012, at First United Methodist Church in Hastings, NE with Rev. Anthony Dawson officiating. Graveside services will be 3:00 p.m., Tuesday at the Ansley Cemetery in Ansley, NE. United Methodist Church Women, the church quilting group, a 50 year member of P.E.O. Chapter L, Mary Lanning Memorial Hospital Auxiliary, the Harvard Parkview Manor Board for 4 years and a former member of the YWCA.

She is survived by her sons, Delvin Stahl and wife Pamela of Sutton, NE; Gaylen Stahl and wife Susie of Juniata, NE; Dr. Marlin Stahl and wife Becky of Omaha, NE; daughter, Denise Stahl of Omaha, NE; 7 grandchildren, 6 great-grandchildren and 2 step great-grandchildren; sisters, Winifred Kulhanek of Fremont, NE and Bethine Dossey of Salt Lake City, UT.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, Gerald and a brother, James Bulla.
