Sutton resident, Andrew Henry Cloet, 88, died Friday, June 24, 2016, while surrounded by his family at Bryan Medical Center West Campus in Lincoln, NE.

Andrew Henry Cloet was born October 28, 1927, in Ingooigem, Belgium to Albrecht and Marie (Messman) Cloet. He received his education at Kortrijk, Belgium. Following WWII, he served with the Belgium Occupation Forces in Cologne, Germany. With some convincing from his Uncle, Reverend Gerald C. Messman, he moved to America and started his farm in Sutton, NE in 1949. He became acquainted with Rose C. Andrijeski by correspondence and they married on December 30, 1957, in Fort Collins, CO. They settled on his farm in Sutton, NE where they raised their five children.

He was a member of the Sutton/Harvard Knights of Columbus. He enjoyed

being on the farm and teaching his children the value of hard work. His favorite sound was that of rainfall. He and his wife enjoyed traveling throughout Europe most especially, visiting his family in Belgium. He remained quite active throughout his life helping with farming and attending his grandchildren's events.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Albrecht and Marie Cloet; and sister, Sr. Sophie Cloet of Belgium.
