Denver, CO resident George W. Wilkins, 57, passed away at his home in Denver on Sunday, August 24, 2014.

Funeral services will be 1:30 p.m., Friday, August 29, 2014, at the Clay Center Christian Church in Clay Center, NE with Pastor Dan Buller officiating. Interment will follow at the Clay Center Cemetery. Visitation will be Friday, from 10:00 a.m. until the time of the service at the church.
