Sutton resident Ronald Eugene Reutzel, 77, passed away Monday, March 20, 2023, at Bryan Medical Center East Campus in Lincoln, NE.

Memorial services will be conducted at 10:30 a.m., Saturday, March 25, 2023, at the Federated Church in Sutton, NE., with Rev. Mary Scott officiating. A luncheon will follow the services at the Church. Graveside services will be conducted at 2:30 p.m., Saturday, at the Firth Cemetery in Firth, NE. He also served as an Assistant Scoutmaster, Hunter Education Teacher, a member of the PTA at Raymond Central HS, and Coach for the Trap Shooting Team at Lincoln High.

Ron was an avid hunter, fisherman, and outdoorsman, and was active in his community and the Federated Church of Sutton.

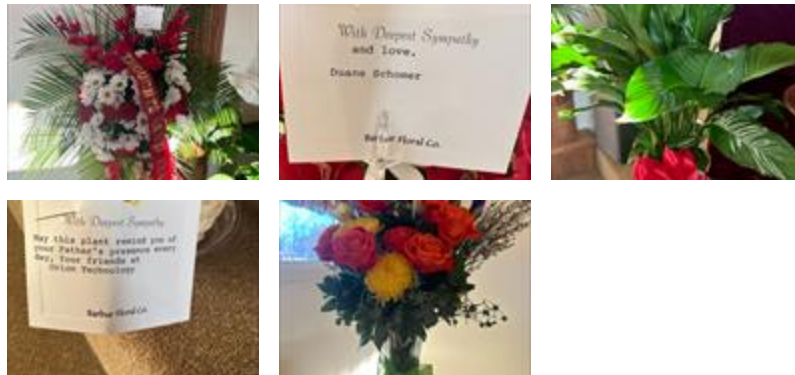
